

## **1970**

## **1972**

The Junior Town Council was formed.

## **1973**

Fourth year numbers fell.

The school uniform was virtually non-existent.

Craig House Hostel was again in full operation.

Work experience was introduced under the Job Trial Placement scheme.

## **1974**

A new system was introduced in Year 8 whereby the Form Teacher had the class for 12 periods a week, thereby providing greater pastoral care.

Inflation hit the Kingia magazine, so for the first time in decades the students had to pay for it.

## **1976**

The Bunbury Junior Town Council was formed from the four high schools in the area.

Interhouse competitions were held in sport, culture, service, social and academic fields.

"It's Academic" was run at lunchtimes.

There was great involvement in sport e.g. the school fielded 10 netball teams.

## **1977**

The Kingia Arts Festival was held.

A group of our French students visited New Caledonia.

## **1978**

The school Naval Cadets set off to sea in the schooner "Vivienne of Struan."

Mrs Shelley Cantoni appointed Deputy Principal Female to Bunbury Senior High School.
