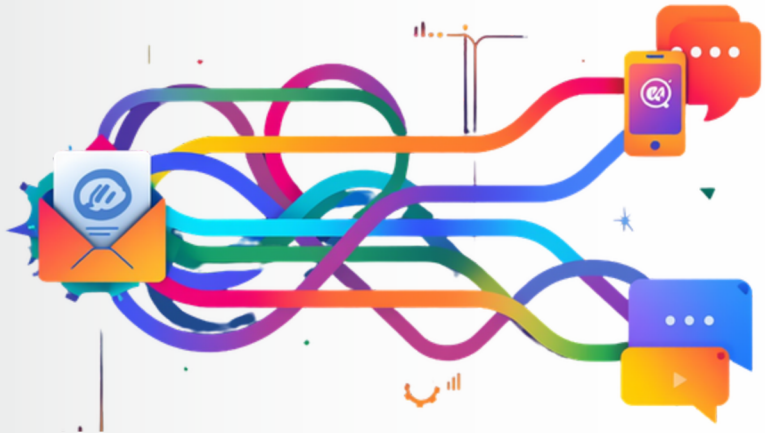

About Us

We aim to provide as many pathways for our students as possible. This ensures that students are geared up and ready for their career, regardless of whether they're leaning toward university or employment.

Our new Cert II programs are the perfect entry point into VET Qualifications and focus on leading the student towards understanding themselves and finding their strengths. This helps them make educated decisions moving forward.

Cert III programs are built around learning the basics of their chosen career and enabling them to solidify their thoughts and feelings about their future choices.

A Certificate IV satisfies many university entrance requirements and can provide entry into a number of non-competitive courses. For competitive courses (e.g. Nursing), students should have a backup option in place, with the intention of transferring into their preferred course after the first semester.

Location

Health Science Hub now operates seven classroom delivery sites across Western Australia, alongside a growing number of students completing our online courses from all over Australia.

In 2026, we expanded into Level 2 at the Perth Hub, giving us two additional classrooms and even more space to support our students' learning.

Technology

All of our courses integrate technology. Students are required to have access to their own device (laptop or tablet) so they can engage with our online content, videos, podcasts, and interactive learning tools. We also use a range of classroom apps designed to help students deepen their understanding of scientific concepts.

- **Cert III in Tourism** (SIT30125, Eco Tourism focus): A great fit for students interested in sustainable travel, events and nature-based experiences, building strong customer service, communication and planning skills.
- **Cert II in Sampling & Measurement:** A hands-on introduction to lab-style work for students who enjoy science and want to build foundational skills in safe procedures, accurate measurement and recording results.

NEW CLASSROOMS

Health Science Hub has expanded into Level 2 at Stirling Street, adding two brand new classrooms to support growing enrolments and improve the student learning experience. The additional space allows for more flexible timetabling, smaller group breakouts when needed, and a smoother flow between theory and practical activities across the day. For VET Coordinators, this expansion also means increased capacity and a more consistent on-campus experience for students studying in Perth.

EQ stands for Emotional Quotient, which refers to the measurement of emotional intelligence. At Health Science Hub, our goal is to support students in developing both their academic capability (IQ) and their emotional intelligence (EQ).

As HSH continues to grow and welcome more students, we recognise the increasing need for tailored, individualised support - particularly for students who are neurodivergent, have learning difficulties, or are experiencing mental health challenges. While we already provide strong support in this space, we are committed to taking this further and becoming leaders in student wellbeing as an RTO.

Process

Every student has access to the EQ Hub. To ensure we can provide the right support from the very beginning, it is essential that we collect accurate information about each student's needs. This relies on students, parents, and VET Coordinators being clear about a student's capabilities and challenges.

We also need to ensure students are academically prepared for our programs, which is why our entry requirements are in place. Once we have a clear understanding of each student's starting point, we can help them work toward the success they are capable of achieving.

Follow Up

Ongoing follow-up is where meaningful support happens. Our EQ Hub team checks in regularly with students (and families where appropriate), monitors progress, and uses a structured system to identify potential issues early. Support plans are reviewed throughout the term, and we work closely with trainers to ensure classroom and assessment accommodations are practical and effective. When additional help is needed, we can also refer students to external services to ensure they receive the right level of care.

COURSE SELECTION GUIDANCE

Pathway

This pathway gives students a strong foundation in allied health, with flexible options to suit their goals. After completing the Certificate III, students can progress into the Certificate IV in Allied Health Assistance to develop advanced, workplace-ready skills. Alternatively, they can move into other health qualifications - such as the Certificate IV in Preparation for Health and Nursing Studies or the Certificate IV in Health Care - to broaden their knowledge and open further study opportunities in the healthcare industry.



HLT33021 Cert III in Allied Health Assistance

The Certificate III in Allied Health Assistance (HLT33021) provides students with a practical introduction to supporting allied health professionals in real-world health and rehabilitation settings. The course focuses on communication, safe work practices, understanding client needs, and building foundational skills used across areas such as physiotherapy, occupational therapy and community health.

This course is well suited to students who: are genuinely interested in allied health, communicate respectfully, work well in teams, and can commit to consistent attendance and weekly coursework.

Students will complete 120 hours of work placement in Semester 2. Schools are responsible for sourcing work placement and providing insurance details.



HLT43021 Cert IV in Allied Health Assistance

The Certificate IV in Allied Health Assistance (HLT43021) is a step up for students who want a more career-focused allied health pathway. It builds advanced skills in supporting therapy programs, working with diverse clients, and communicating professionally in healthcare environments, with higher expectations around independence and consistent workload.

This course suits organised students who are serious about allied health pathways and professional practice.

Entry requires successful completion of one of the following courses: Certificate III in Allied Health Assistance, Certificate III in Health Services Assistance, or Certificate III in Basic Health Care.

Students will complete 120 hours of work placement in Semester 1. Schools are responsible for sourcing work placement and providing insurance details.

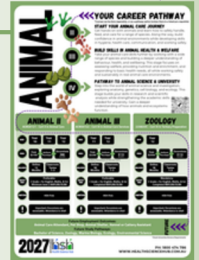
COURSE SELECTION GUIDANCE

Pathway

This pathway provides a clear progression from hands-on animal care to further study, while still allowing students to follow what they enjoy most. Students can begin with the Certificate II in Animal Care, a practical introduction focused mainly on domestic pets. From there, they can move into either an animal care pathway or a marine conservation pathway, adjusting their next steps as their interests develop.

Students can then progress to the Certificate III in Animal Care Services to broaden experience with mammals, reptiles and birds, and build stronger animal health and welfare skills. For students seeking a university pathway, the Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation (Zoology) develops academic communication and animal biology foundations for tertiary study in zoology or animal and biological science degrees.

This pathway is recommended for building skills in order, however, students may enter at any level provided they meet the entry requirements for the chosen qualification.

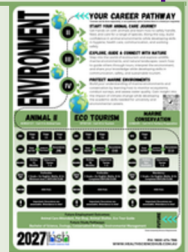


ENVIRONMENT

COURSE SELECTION GUIDANCE

Pathway

This pathway is a recommended progression for students interested in environmental and marine-focused study outcomes, while still giving them room to follow what they enjoy most. Students can begin with the Certificate II in Animal Care to build practical, hands-on foundations, then move into the Certificate III in Tourism (Eco Tourism focus) to develop people-facing skills in communication, customer service and planning through the lens of sustainable, nature-based experiences. For students aiming for a university pathway, the Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation (Marine Conservation) builds the academic communication, research and study skills needed for tertiary learning in marine science, conservation and environmental fields.



This pathway is recommended for building skills in order, however, students may enter at any level provided they meet the entry requirements for the chosen qualification.

ACM20121 Cert II in Animal Care

The Certificate II in Animal Care (ACM20121) is a hands-on introduction to safe animal care, focused on domestic pets such as dogs, cats, and other companion animals. It builds foundational skills in handling, behaviour, hygiene and welfare, and gives students a realistic understanding of working in animal-related fields. It is an ideal starting point for students considering future study or work in animal care.

This course suits students who genuinely enjoy working with animals, can follow instructions, and are reliable with weekly attendance, as excursions and incursions form a significant part of assessment.



SIT30125 Cert III in Tourism NEW

The Certificate III in Tourism (SIT30125) prepares students to confidently guide people in a variety of natural environments, identify fauna in the field, interpret marine and land ecosystems, monitor weather conditions, and create engaging tour commentary that brings landscapes to life. Students develop strong communication skills to brief groups, present interpretive content, work with diverse audiences and provide exceptional customer service. With remote first aid and animal first aid included, they are equipped to lead responsibly in outdoor and isolated settings. The course also builds skills in using social media professionally and ethically to promote tours and develop a digital presence in the tourism and eco-adventure industry.

Marine Conservation - ***Does not provide WACE Points for WA Students**

The Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation (Marine Conservation) is an academic pathway program for students aiming for further study in marine science, conservation and environmental fields. It builds strong skills in communication, research and study strategies while exploring marine and environmental concepts to support tertiary-level learning.

This course suits motivated students who can manage consistent written work, meet deadlines, engage with regular reading and writing tasks, and handle the independent study expectations of a university-style workload.

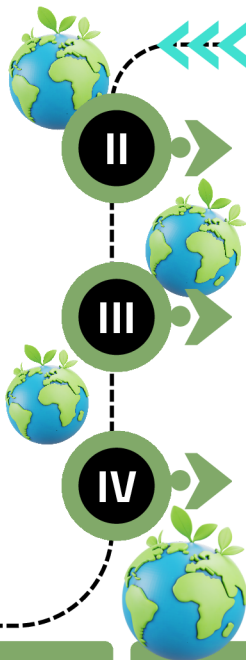

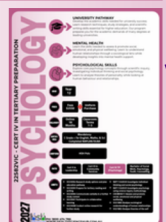

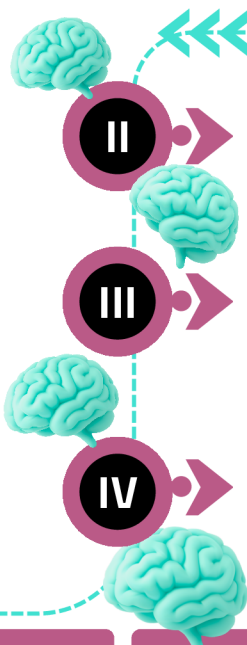

Students are encouraged to begin with a Certificate III in an area they genuinely enjoy, then progress into the Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation (Teaching & Learning) to build the academic communication, research and study skills needed for tertiary success in an education context. After Year 12, eligible students can continue into the Diploma of Teacher Education Preparation, a post-school program that provides multiple unit credits towards a Murdoch University teaching degree through an agreed pathway credit arrangement.

While this pathway is ideal for building foundational skills in a recommended order, students can enter at any level as long as they meet the entry requirements for the chosen qualification.



Certificate III in an Area of Interest

Starting with a Certificate III in their chosen area helps students build real subject knowledge and confidence before moving into teaching-focused study. It also allows them to explore what they might enjoy teaching in the future.

For example, a student aiming to teach Science might choose Certificate III in Laboratory Skills, while a student interested in Health and Physical Education might choose Certificate III in Fitness. This makes the pathway more personalised and motivating, and provides a stronger foundation for the Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation (Teaching & Learning) and future teaching degrees.

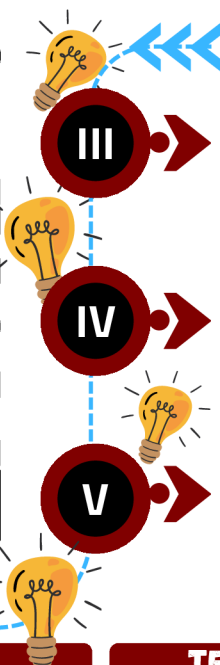


22602VIC Diploma of Teacher Education Preparation

The Diploma of Teacher Education Preparation is a post-Year 12 pathway program for students committed to progressing into a teaching degree. Entry requires successful completion of a Certificate IV. Additional credit transfers apply for students who have completed the Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation (Teaching & Learning).

SIS30321 Cert III in Fitness

Students build foundation knowledge in training principles, safe exercise instruction and working with clients, while developing the confidence and communication skills needed to lead others in a professional setting. Students build foundation skills in taking samples, making measurements, following procedures and recording results accurately, with a strong focus on safety and attention to detail.

Pathway

This pathway is recommended for students interested in hands-on healthcare and emergency-style learning, with strong links to real event medic experiences. Students begin with the Certificate III in Basic Health Care to build foundational clinical skills, professionalism and confidence in practical scenarios, then progress into the Certificate IV in Health Care for more advanced practice and increased workplace responsibility.

Work placement is a key part of both programs and is completed with our medic event management partners during weekends, evenings and school holidays, so this pathway best suits reliable students who can commit to attendance and out-of-hours placement shifts.

For both courses, students will need to purchase a **Medic Kit** through our website, which includes PPE, medic resources and clinical assessment equipment (such as a stethoscope and blood pressure cuff). These items are used throughout the course for practical assessments and can be kept for future career experiences.

Entry into the Certificate IV in Health Care requires successful completion of an approved Certificate III pathway qualification.

HLT31220 Cert III in Basic Health Care

The Certificate III in Basic Health Care (HLT31220) is an introductory medic-focused program for students interested in healthcare and emergency-style learning. Students build foundational clinical skills, develop professionalism and confidence in practical scenarios, and learn to communicate respectfully in real-world health contexts. The course includes regular practical assessment in the classroom, so weekly attendance is essential. Students are also encouraged to complete a minimum of 10 hours of work placement with our medic event management partners, undertaken during weekends, evenings and school holidays.

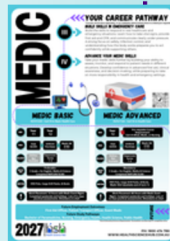
This course suits students who are reliable, calm under pressure, comfortable with hands-on health content, and able to communicate respectfully in practical scenarios.

HLT41120 Cert IV in Health Care

The Certificate IV in Health Care (HLT41120) is an advanced medic-focused program for students who are serious about a healthcare pathway and ready to meet higher expectations around professional practice and communication. It is particularly suited to students who have already completed one of our Certificate III medical-focused programs and are prepared for more advanced clinical skills, workplace responsibility and independent learning. Students are required to complete a minimum of 80 hours of work placement with our medic event management partners, undertaken during weekends, evenings and school holidays, and must also attend a full-weekend orientation training course at the end of Term 1. Weekly attendance is essential due to regular practical assessment.

This course suits students who are organised and mature, committed to a healthcare pathway, able to meet workplace-style expectations, and ready for the responsibility of out-of-hours placement and professional communication.

Entry requires successful completion of Certificate III in Health Services Assistance, Certificate III in Basic Health Care, or Certificate III in Allied Health Assistance.

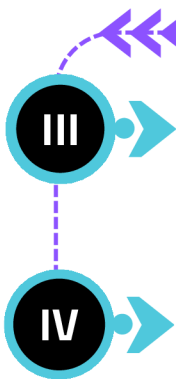

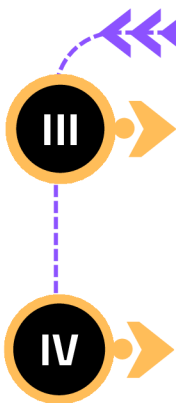

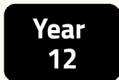
