From the Principal

I feel fortunate that I am regularly able to report on the successes that occur in our school. Two significant successes that have occurred since the last newsletter are our Champion School victory at County Week, and our progression to finalists in the WA Education Awards Secondary School of the Year.

Country Week is a major event on the annual school calendar for all regional high schools and it remains one of the highlights of schooling for many current and former students. This year we were represented by approximately 150 students and staff, who were involved in competitions across 13 sports and activities. We have been very successful at Country Week in the period since our first Champion School win in 2009 and this year's victory marked four in a row. It is an outstanding result, made more notable because we are far from the largest school competing. It is a testament to the wonderful culture we have in the school around Country Week, as well as the ongoing commitment from our students and dedicated staff.

Our selection as finalists in the Secondary School of the Year category of the WA Education Awards is a wonderful recognition for the school community. With 110-ish secondary public schools in WA, being named in the top four is an enormous achievement. The Awards consider all aspects of a school's performance. Therefore, while it is easy to point to our ATAR results, NAPLAN data and sporting successes as some clear indicators of achievement, the Awards look equally at the quality of teaching and leadership, the learning environment and support for disadvantaged groups, and connection with the community, as true indicators of a school's value. The winner is announced later in the year.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the families, students and staff who have supported our current exchange students from Japan. It has been tremendous having these guests in the school, sharing their culture while experiencing ours, and adding to our already rich diversity. I trust that, for the families who have billeted students, it has been just as equally rewarding.
